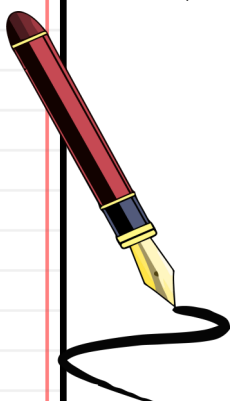
difficult, how critical the situation is, there is always something bright that keeps shining and giving hope that things will get better one day. This light and hope are now here and we want to share them with you!

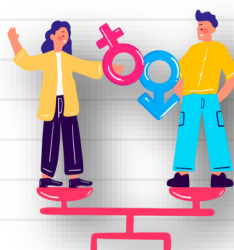

Gender Equality

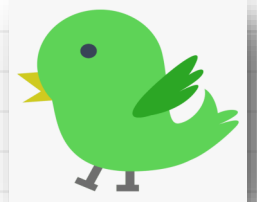

Reading Is Dreaming With Open Eyes!

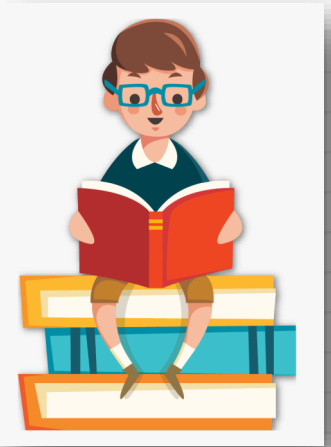

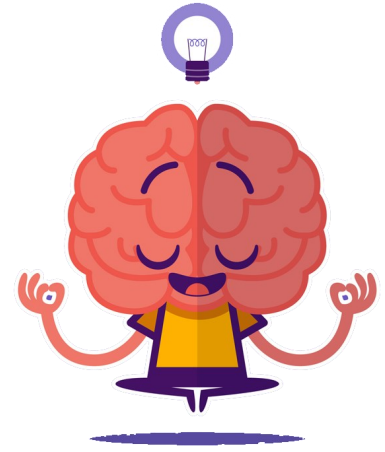
Brain is a precious place and it has capacity to build or break, flourish or fail and thrive or thrash. Let us focus on positive thoughts and make our lives worth living!

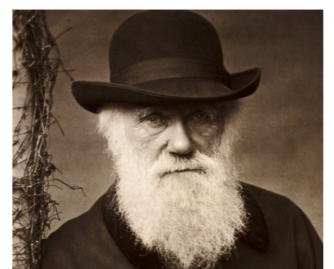
An extraordinary day indeed! Sometimes small things in life can give you a lot of happiness.

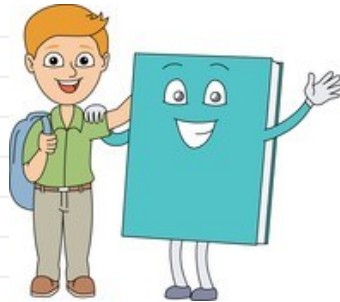




Books - A Window To the World
