

Next time we see our children collecting things and making a game together let's stop, focus and listen so that we can recognize, appreciate and encourage the learning that is happening.

Princess Sheena





Monsters Of The Universe.

Astrology is possibly the best way to learn science, since it includes physics and mathematics. Also, there is so much mystery, knowledge and curiosity that we find in deep space. We are very miniscule in front of these monsters, almost like a speck! We are all but made out of stardust, and to quote Stephen Hawking here, "While there is life there is hope."

So, my friends let's look up and enjoy the facts I am sharing with you. Monsters of the universe are types of cosmological objects, but unlike other cosmological objects they are very dangerous. Yes, ever since the creation of the universe there have been many monsters in existence. Some of these monsters are ...

1. **Black holes**: Black holes are a region of space that consumes any object that is near it. A Black hole can bend time and can even catch light. It can suck up everything in its path and whatever goes in it never comes out. White holes are exactly the opposite of black holes. There are four types of black holes: Miniature, Stellar, Super stellar and Massive.

Fun fact- Black holes cannot be seen as they can absorb even light.

2. **Supernovas**: Supernovas are another type of cosmological object that are formed at the end of the life cycle of a star. Stars much bigger than our sun actually turn into Supernova. They are very bright and very hot! The temperature of a supernova can be around 100 billion degrees. They are highly explosive and if they explode, they can cause massive destruction because a Supernova has a lot of energy and radiation inside it which is thrown out at the time of its formation.

Fun Fact - our sun will not turn into a Supernova when it dies because it is small in size. Our sun will turn into a white dwarf at the end of its life.

3. **Quasars**: Quasars are mysterious travelling cosmological rogue objects with a black hole in the center. They are packed with a lot of energy and radiation. Some Quasars can be bigger than our whole solar system combined. They can explode like a Supernova but can cause more destruction because they are much bigger in size and have much more energy in them. Their energy can even destroy the gravitational field that keeps everything in space together.

Fun Fact - If a Quasar comes near our Earth, it will destroy our gravitational field which is holding the earth to the sun, the earth will drift off into space and our planet will become a rogue planet.

4. **Rogue stars**: Rogue stars are stars which float around in space aimlessly. They don't stay in a constellation. They can move freely in space which makes them so dangerous.

Fun Fact - Gliese 710 is a red dwarf rogue star. If by chance it passes near our Earth, it can disrupt the Earth's orbit completely and we will get kicked out of our solar system!

5. **Wormholes**: Wormholes are mysterious objects that are found deep in space. They are objects which can take you on a journey through the universe in record time but are very bad for our universe as they are actually ripples in the space time continuum, which can cause disruption in the universal balance.

Fun fact - If you get sucked into one of these wormholes, there is a high possibility that you will get crushed by it and will be converted into energy, similar to what would happen to you inside of a black hole.
