CODE OF CONDUCT FOR SCHOLARS

- 1. To maintain discipline, speed up progress and streamline efficiency, we are obliged to take certain precautionary measures in the institution. Their compliance is compulsory and any failure to do so may necessitate disciplinary action without prior notice.**
- 2. Running, playing shouting or any other disturbance during study hours is not permitted. All games and sports activities are restricted to the duration allotted and fixed according to the time-table at the respective sports facilities.**
- 3. Scholars must accord due respect to their teachers, support staff, peers and authorities. They must be courteous and polite to them under all circumstances.**

Scholars must respect school property. Any violation which might cause damage to school property or bring harm to its staff or any other scholar will invoke strict disciplinary action.

- 4. Transport – Scholars are expected to be well behaved and courteous while using the school transport. Any indiscipline in the school transport will result in withdrawal of the facility.**

a) The Bus Stop / Bus Route of children once decided cannot be changed for few days or one day, for any reason. To ensure the safety of children such request will not be entertained. Negotiation with the bus guard/driver regarding this is strictly prohibited.

b) In case a child who is a bus user is not using the bus on a particular day but is going with his/her parents, the teachers has to be informed via e-mail or a written note in the diary about the same , a day in advance

c) If parents for some reason cannot intimate the teacher in advance, they must inform the School Reception about the same. The teacher will be informed duly by them.

d) It is mandatory to show the Escort Card while collecting children from their Bus Stops or School premises. The child will be handed over to only authorize people whose pictures are there in the Escort Card.

e) Two Escort Cards can be issued to parents on extra payment basis. Parent may request for a change of authorized people in the Escort Card.

5. The school timings need to be adhered to as a lifestyle which inculcates punctuality and discipline. All scholars must comply with the school timings. Any scholars reporting late will not be allowed to enter the school premises and will be asked to go back home from the gate in the same vehicle. The school shall in no way be responsible to send the scholar back in such cases. Continuous default might lead to suspension.

6. The school uniform truly binds all scholars together as one big family. All Scholars must come neatly dressed and properly groomed to school. Any kind of alteration to the school dress is strictly prohibited. The girls' hair must either be cut short or tied back neatly. In case of short hair, they must wear a black hairband only. No long, dangling earrings, nail paint or face makeup is permitted. The boys' hair (except Sikhs) should also be trimmed regularly. Hair styling, colouring, and weird haircuts are not allowed.

7. The school takes pride in educating the pupil in personal hygiene and cleanliness. But it is the duty of each scholar to maintain and adopt a hygienic lifestyle.

8. Students are expected to observe proper etiquettes and table manners in the Central Dining Hall. Students are expected to maintain orderliness and exhibit proper behavior. Students should ensure that there is no wastage of food. Entry to the kitchen and store room is prohibited.

9. Under no circumstances will the school authorities be held responsible for any kind of indiscipline and misconduct on the part of the scholar outside the school premises.

10. All scholars must have a minimum attendance of 90%. A scholar might be detained at the time of the examination if he/she falls short of this minimum requirement.

11. The scholar must carry their textbooks, notebooks, and the school Year Book regularly to school.

12. A scholar is issued a blue, yellow or red card by school depending on the act of misdemeanor and after sustained counselling has failed to get the scholar on the right track. Any such card.

13. As the medium of instruction in this school is English, scholars should converse in English as often as possible.

14. No visitor will be allowed to contact any scholar during school hours without the permission of the Principal.

15. No scholar will be called from the class to attend any phone call unless it is very urgent.

16. Participation in all school activities and functions is compulsory and school uniform is to be worn at all school functions unless allowed otherwise.

17. Carrying cell phones, recording/playback devices (Ipods, MP3 players, FM, Radio etc.) is prohibited. Scholars must not wear expensive wrist watches and jewelry to school. If a student is found in unauthorized possession of a mobile phone, it shall be confiscated and kept in the office of the Principal for 90 days. The SIM card will however be returned to the parents. After this period of 90 days the parents may collect the phone on submitting a fine which shall be spent on charity chosen by Student Council.

18. Cameras may be brought to School on special occasions or for a Club activity only with prior permission from the Class Teacher.

**19. The school has zero tolerance for: (1) Bullying / Physical Violence
(2) Use of tobacco, alcohol, narcotic drugs.**
