Emotional Learning

Emotional learning is a crucial component of our students' education and personal development. Emotional learning curriculum focuses on teaching students how to recognize, understand, and regulate their emotions effectively. Through this curriculum, we equip our students with the skills and knowledge they need to navigate the challenges of growing up and build healthy relationships with others.

The curriculum includes a range of activities and strategies, including mindfulness practices, journaling, and role-playing exercises. Through these activities, students learn how to: Identify and express their emotions, manage stress and anxiety, build positive relationships with peers, resolve conflicts effectively and make responsible decisions.





Relationship and Diversity- To sow the seeds of kindness, students planted a kindness garden. They wrote few lines about different ways to be kind.





Collaboration- Students enjoyed passing the hula hoop while exploring teamwork. This activity helped them understand the importance of working together.



Emotional Learning





Kindness bucket- Students loved listening to the Kindness Bucket story and shared their views and felt pride in sharing their acts of kindness. They were thrilled showcasing their acts of kindness through enactment and drawing. Their creativity was well depicted through their expression.

Sensory Corners

Sensory corners are an excellent way to provide children with opportunities to engage in sensory experiences. Students from prenursery to PYP 5 created a space that was uniquely theirs, a cozy nook to retreat to, and engage their senses. These spaces helped them manage their emotions and develop their focus and concentration. The process of setting up the sensory corner was an enjoyable activity for them as it helped them develop essential skills while having fun. Students took onus of the corner by bringing in objects and materials they liked and arranged it in a pleasing and usable way that. They created sensory boxes, sensory tracing paths, sensory bags, indoor sensory walkways and different sensory stations. This fostered a sense of creativity, sensitivity and pride among the students.



Wellbeing Week

The key to a healthy life is having a healthy mind. Keeping the same in mind Wellbeing Week was celebrated to promote the idea among our students. The focus of the week was on activities that encouraged students to take care of their mental and physical health, with a particular emphasis on being around Nature.

Being around Nature is an important aspect of overall wellness, and this idea was incorporated into the activities for the week.

Some of the activities included stretching exercises, walking barefoot on grass, reflecting on the role of Nature in our lives and making memories of it. Students went on a Nature walk and learned about the importance of fruit in their diet through the "Wellness fruit" activity, created Happiness Jar, appreciated Nature and learned about the impact of external environment on our well-being.

Mentor-Mentee Program



It also instilled values such as intrinsic motivation, self-discipline, and curiosity, and provided a platform for forming strong bonds with each other in small groups across multiple grades. The program helped children develop strong connections with their peers by creating a safe and secure environment for sharing thoughts, ideas, and feelings. Play Week





Parent Child Program

A Parent child program is a specially designed program to help toddlers prepare for 'Pre-School' phase. The program helps in emotional, physical, intellectual, social and creative development of the baby, it helps kids to be more independent, develop imaginative thinking, enhance gross/fine motor and hand-eye co-ordination skills. The Parents get a chance to be part of initial learning journey of their child and are exposed to the learning activities which are full of fun and leading to the source for experiences that a child can have in the early years, making it the most powerful tool to influence the child's early development. Also, the program builds trust and understanding between parent and child and strengthening the bond.





Physical play and yoga

Physical play and yoga helps a child to develop coordination, balance, gross-motor skills (large movements like crawling and walking) and supports cognitive development.

Children learn to coordinate and control their bodies and the movement helps them develop spatial awareness



Story

Through stories children stimulates their imagination and expands their understanding of the world. It helps them develop language and listening skills and prepares them to understand the world.

Children learn to focus; it also helps in enhancing memory. Children learn to sing the song and explores instruments.
