ENGLISH LEARNING EXPERIENCE - WHEN IDU MEETS SAA!

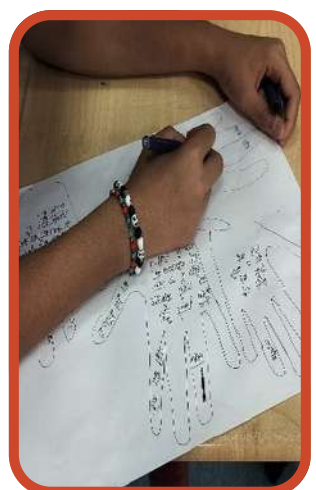

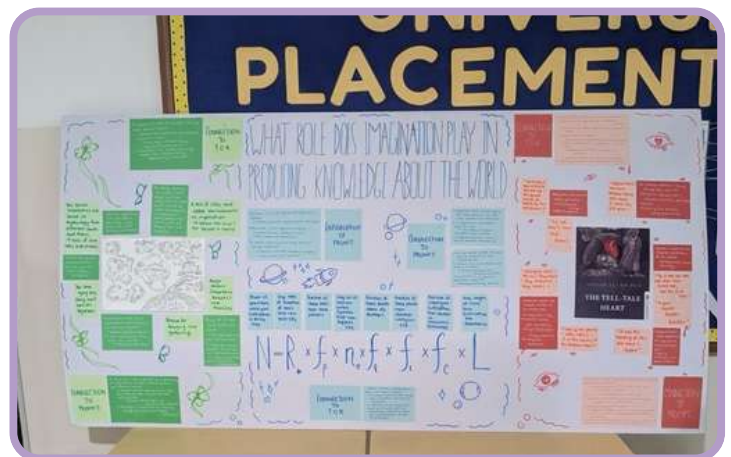
TOK Exhibition

CHEMISTRY INTEGRATION INTO CAS

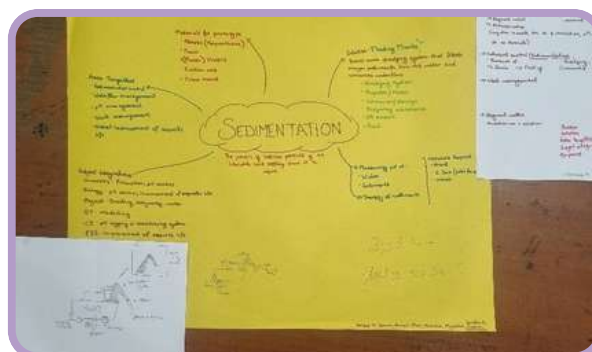

COLLABORATIVE SCIENCE PROJECT (CSP) INTRODUCTION/PLANNING PHASE

To ensure a meaningful investigation, Mr. Dushyant and Mr. Arunava visited Okhla Bird Sanctuary in advance to identify safe, useful research spots. They captured photos and videos, later shared with students during the Introduction Phase of the CSP. On 20th March 2025, the Introduction/Planning Phase was conducted in Physics Lab, 3rd floor. DP1 students were divided into six interdisciplinary groups representing various Group 4 subjects. After viewing the media, each group identified key environmental issues, formulated research questions, mapped ideas, and outlined investigation plans. Subject experts planned their exploration areas for the field trip. Teams also listed materials and strategized solutions. The phase showcased collaboration, critical thinking, and problem-solving, setting the stage for a productive Action Phase.



COLLABORATIVE SCIENCE PROJECT

COLLABORATIVE SCIENCE PROJECT (CSP) ACTION PHASE

On 28th March 2025, DP1 students embarked on a field trip to Okhla Bird Sanctuary to investigate the environmental issues identified during the Planning Phase. They visited their chosen research spots and actively collected water, soil, and algae samples, recorded temperature data using probes, and measured noise levels with sound sensors for further analysis. Back at school, students began analyzing their collected samples and data, working diligently to develop solutions. Each subject expert proceeded to their respective Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Computer Science, and Design Technology labs to conduct in-depth investigations and find answers to their group's research question. The collaborative spirit and dedication demonstrated by the students were remarkable. Through prototypes, models, and presentations, they worked towards resolving the identified issues. Their efforts will culminate in the Exhibition Phase on 7th April 2025, where they will evaluate their findings and showcase their proposed solutions.

पंजाब में होली को बहुत जोश और उल्लास के साथ मना जाता है और होली को होला मोहल्ला के नाम से जाना जाता है। यह त्योहार आनंदपुर साहिब में सिख समुदाय द्वारा मनाया जाता है, जहाँ घुड़सवारी, युद्ध कला प्रदर्शन और कीर्तन होते हैं। लोग एक-दूसरे पर रंग और गुलाल लगाकर ढोल की थाप पर भांगड़ा और गिद्धा नृत्य करते हैं।

मथुरा की होली



मथुरा और वृंदावन में बरसाना की लठमार होली और वृंदावन में फूलों की होली का खास संगम दिखाई देता है। रक्षाधीन और बांके बिहारी मंदिरों में भजन-कीर्तन और रंगों की बाँछार के साथ भक्ति की जाती है। खासतौर पर भक्ति में रंगों के साथ समाहित होते हुए, कई बार अपने भगवान की मूर्तियों की झलकियाँ भी प्रदर्शित करते हैं।

बरसाना की होली



यह त्योहार हिंदू भगवान कृष्ण और राधा की लीलाओं पर आधारित है। कृष्ण ने अपनी प्रिय राधा और उनकी सखियों के साथ लाठी से खेलते थे। होली के दिन बरसाने में आज भी सारे पति पत्नी वही लीलाओं का उत्सव लाठी और ढाल के साथ मनाते हैं।

चंडी शक्ला

होलों के अलग-अलग रूप



बंगाल में होली को 'ढोल जात्रा' या 'बसंत उत्सव' के रूप में मनाया जाता है। यहाँ यह त्योहार शांति निकेतन में विशेष रूप से प्रसिद्ध है, जहाँ रवींद्रनाथ टैगोर ने इसे सांस्कृतिक रंग दिया। लोग पीले कपड़े पहनते हैं, गीत-संगीत और नृत्य करते हैं। रंगों के साथ अबीर (गुलाल) खेला जाता है और भगवान कृष्ण की पूजा की जाती है। बंगाल की होली सांस्कृतिक और पारंपरिक रंगों से भरपूर होती है, जो इसे खास बनाती है।



गिरपुर में होली को (याओशांग) के रूप में मनाया जाता है, जो पाँच दिनों तक चलता है। यह सिर्फ रंगों का त्योहार नहीं, बल्कि इसमें थाबल चोंगबा नामक पारंपरिक नृत्य भी किया जाता है। लोग मंदिरों में जा करते हैं, एक-दूसरे पर रंग डालते हैं और पूरे जय में खुशी और उमंग का माहौल रहता है। यहाँ लीला का उत्सव सांस्कृतिक और धार्मिक परंपराओं जुड़ा होता है, जो इसे बाकी भारत से थोड़ा अलग बनाता है।



कानपुर में होली का त्योहार बहुत धूमधाम से मनाया जाता है। यहाँ की लठमार होली और गुलाल गोटा होली खास होती हैं। लोग एक-दूसरे को रंग और गुलाल लगाते हैं, ढोल-नगाड़ों के साथ नाचते-गाते हैं और गुझिया, ठंडाई जैसी मिठाइयों का आनंद लेते हैं। होली के दिन कानपुर के बाजारों और गलियों में रंगों की बारिश होती है, और हर कोई इस खुशी के पर्व में शामिल होता है।

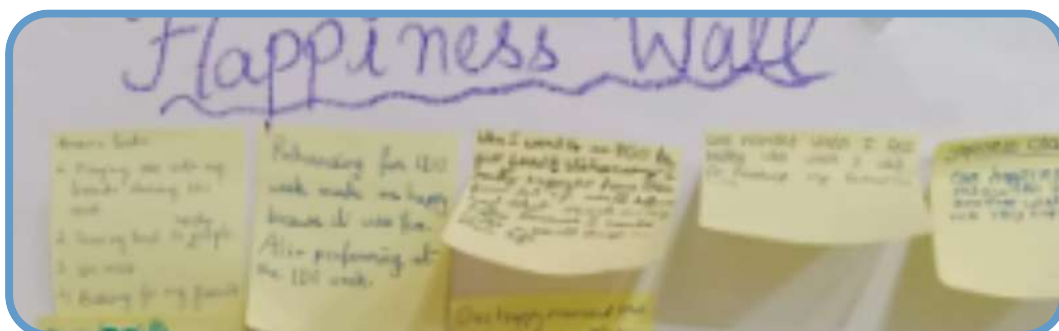
THRIVING BEYOND ACADEMICS
